


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**

279,233 acres in 2002, 294,071 acres in 1997, down 5 percent.

805 acres in 2002, 835 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$53,904,000 in 2002, \$69,522,000 in 1997, down 22 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$51,858,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$2,045,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$155,342 in 2002, \$197,504 in 1997, down 21 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
